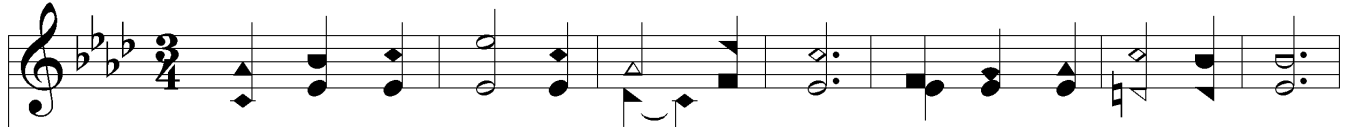


Unseen, But Known
