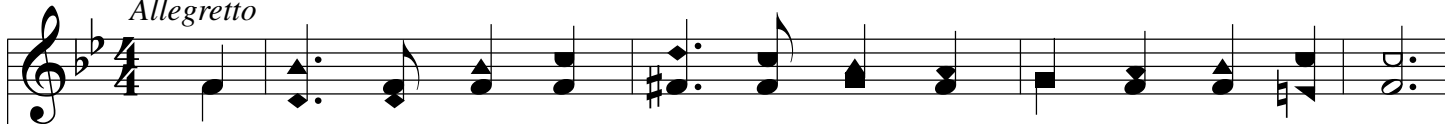


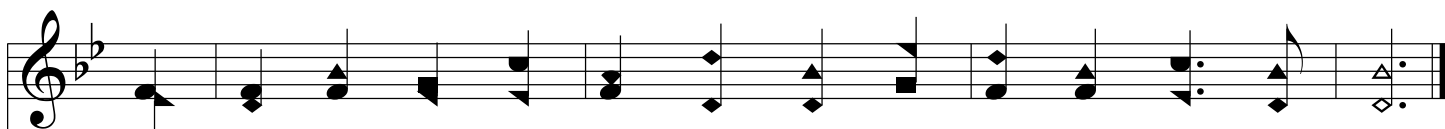
Lord, Who Is He That Happy May
